CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) is a volunteer driven guardian ad litem program that trains everyday people to advocate for abused and neglected children in juvenile court.

Age Minimum: 21

CASA Volunteer – Volunteers work independently to gather information on a child whose family is involved in the children's services system. The volunteer will develop a relationship with the child in order to identify their needs and be able to advocate for their best interest. They will write reports with recommendations and attend hearings on behalf of the child. They will then monitor the case until the child achieves permanency.

Time Commitment:

A volunteer is asked to commit between ten and fifteen (10 - 15) hours a month. Hearings and meetings require attendance. Other visits are flexible.

Training:

Thirty (30) hours of training according to National CASA Curriculum, 3 hours of county specific training, plus 6 hours of courtroom training.

Must pass thorough background check and be able to conduct an independent investigation in order to advocate for children in court.


