# Sandusky County Public Health – Cribs for Kids

Jane\* was an 18-year-old single expectant mother who recently was laid off from her job. She was living with her boyfriend, the father of the baby, but had to move back home due to troubles in the relationship. The sudden change in her living situation left her with little resources to provide for her new baby that was due to arrive in 3 weeks. A friend had told her about the Cribs for Kids program available through Sandusky County Public Health. Jane called the Health Department, and the nurse explained the program and eligibility requirements. Jane was able to pick up a crib with her mother's assistance and she was able to set it up correctly with directions provided to her over the phone. J delivered a healthy baby at the local hospital and was prepared to bring the baby home and provide a safe sleep environment for her new daughter. She also had the knowledge to address the challenges of bringing a new infant home, including infant feeding, growth and development and general infant care.

Diane had recently moved to Ohio and was struggling to find a place to live. She had been living on and off with family but soon found herself in a situation that seemed hopeless. With the help and support of her physician, she was connected to the Liberty Center and soon discovered they had the tools and resources to help her get back on her feet. After only four short weeks, Diane was able to find an affordable apartment and has been living there for over a year. Diane credits the Liberty Center's amazing staff for helping her get back on her feet and getting her life back on track.

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# YMCA of Sandusky County Child Development Program



At age 4, John's\* mom choose the YMCA Childcare due to the special amenities they offered. Part of a two-household family, John had many social/emotional problems, including severe attachment issues, as well as with transitioning from various activities. John was not able to write any letters, possessed little fine motor skills, and was lacking in other skills that a child of his age typically has. In addition to the support and resources the YMCA offered, they were also able to refer John to the Childcare Resource Center for additional support services.






